About Amsterdam

Entry Requirements

Your Passport must be valid on the date of Entry. Visas are free and will be given at the port of entry.

Weather

You can expect the temperature during this time of year between 60F - 65F.

Language

Dutch is the official language, but English is widely spoken.

Tipping

Many services already have a service charge added to the bill. If this is the case, you aren't obliged to tip extra. Tipping in the Netherlands, like in most of Europe, isn't really expected. However, leaving extra change or rounding up the bill in restaurants, bars and cafés is common.

Electrical Outlets

The voltage which comes from a Dutch power outlet is 230 volts, whereas 120 voltsis used in America. If your US appliance or charger can't handle dual voltage then you will need to use a suitable power converter for Netherlands which allows a 120 volt American appliance to work with a 220-240 volt outlet.

Crime and Safety

In the Safe City Index 2015 Amsterdam takes the 5th position in the list of safest cities in the world (2015). Though you can buy marihuana freely in coffee shops, smart drugs in smart shops and prostitution is legal, Amsterdam is not a dangerous city. The city does especially well in regard to traffic. Because everyone travels by bike there are not many traffic accidents and the air in Amsterdam is not (much) polluted. For crime, Amsterdam is also safe. The risk of violent assault in Amsterdam is pretty much absent, in all parts of the city. Also, crime rates in general in Amsterdam are doing down every year.

IN DEPTH

City Tour



You will see the city's major highlights, such as the Museum Square, dominated by the Rijksmuseum, the Van Gogh Museum and the Concertgebouw, the Dam Square with its Royal Palace, New Church and National Monument, and the Western Church next to Anne Frank House. Marvel at the cutting-edge architecture of the Eastern Docklands

and soak-up the atmosphere of the historic ring of canals. See the major canals running all around the city, proclaimed a World Heritage Domain by UNESCO, the Munt Tower, a converted watchtower of Amsterdam's medieval protective wall, ending at the Red Light District and the Old Harbour.

Canal Cruise

An Amsterdam canal cruise is compulsory for anybody visiting the 'Venice of the North.' Amsterdam is laced with 100km of waterways, so there is no better way to experience the essence of the Dutch capital than on an Amsterdam canal cruise. Wind past grand merchant houses, Gothic churches, museums, and medieval buildings as you soak up the city's history on a



fascinating audio guide. The canal tour starts at the very heart of the city: the Amstel river and World Heritage-listed 17th-century canals. Revel in the grand baroque architecture as your camera gets a real workout. Enjoy sights of the most famous of the waterways, like the Herengracht, Keizersgracht, and Prinsengracht. You will also sail by the iconic Skinny Bridge, Stopera and the Blauwbrug.

Half day Zaanse Schans Tour



The Zaanse Schans is a delightful village on the banks of the river Zaan with characteristic green wooden houses, charming stylized gardens, small hump-backed bridges, tradesmen's workshops, historic windmills and engaging little shops. This enchanting village has been lovingly established by relocating local houses, windmills, storehouses and barns to form a remarkable replica of a typical "Zaanse" village of the seventeenth and eighteenth century. Apart from the cluster of windmills,

characteristic wooden houses and delightful shops to visit, there are intriguing traditional Dutch crafts such as wooden shoes, pewter and cheese making, several fascinating museums, restaurants and even the possibility of taking a boat trip on the river.

Museums

Begijnhof in Amsterdam

1012 Amsterdam, Netherlands

The Begijnhof is an enclosed courtyard dating from the early 14th century. Nothing survived of the earliest dwellings, but the Begijnhof, which is cut off from Amsterdam's traffic noise, still retains a sanctified atmosphere. The Begijnhof was originally built as a sactuary for the Begijntjes, a Catholic sisterhood who lived like nuns, although they took no monastic vows.





The beautiful houses overlook its well-kept green garden, include the Amsterdam's oldest surviving house Het Houten Huis dating from around 1420. On the adjoining walls, there is a fascinating collection of wall plaques with biblical theme. Southern fringe of the square is dominated by the Engelse Kerk (English Church) which dates from the 15 century and possesses its original medieval tower. Houses in Begijnhof are still occupied by single women, so please respect their privacy and be quiet. The Begijnhof Chapel (No. 29 and 30), a clandestine church, was completed in 1680. It contains many reminders of the Catholic past.

Rijksmuseum Distance from hotel: .75 Miles





The Rijksmuseum, which in English means – The State Museum, exists for more than two hundred years and today belongs to the most breathtaking museums in the world. During its existence, the museum went through many transformations and remains now, especially after its complete renovation, the attraction you should not miss during your trip to the Netherlands.

Van Gogh Museuem Museumplein 6, 1071 DJ Amsterdam, Netherlands

Amsterdam Van Gogh Museum maintains the world's largest collection of the works of the world's most popular artist - Vincent van Gogh (1853-1890), his paintings, drawings and letters, completed with the art of his contemporaries. Each year, 1.6 million visitors come to the Van Gogh Museum, making it one of the 25 most popular museums in the world. In 2015, the museum added the new glass entrance hall at the back of its building.
