Payment Arrangements

- Your \$200 deposit is due 11/15. All deposits are only \$100 if made by 10/30 using the code "IdLikeSomeChilePlease".
- Your first monthly payment will be collected 30 days after your deposit is made or by 11/30/20 whichever comes first. Each of the subsequent payments will be collected every 30 days until 12/30/21 for a total of 14 payments(Nov(20) – Dec(21))

Refund Policy

- Your deposit is fully refundable for 15 days after it has been paid, or until 11/15 , whichever comes first. 50% of your deposit can applied to a future trip within a years' time of this trip being cancelled.
- Each monthly payment, except the final payment, becomes non-refundable 30 days after the due date for that payment. Your final payment becomes non-refundable upon it's due date (Dec 30 2021)
- Refunds can take up to 30 days from the date requested to process.
- In the event we are not able to visit our main desired destination (Chile) for any reason, our only recourse is to postpone to a later date(s). If you are unable to attend the new dates, we will offer you the option to go anytime on your own. Any request to cancel under this circumstance will abide by our above refund/cancellation policy.

IN DEPTH

Centro Cultural Palacio La Moneda y Plaza de la Ciudadanía

Underground art takes on a new meaning in Centro Cultural Palacio La Moneda a glass-slab roof floods the vaultlike space with natural light, and ramps wind down through the central atrium past the Cineteca Nacional, a state-run art-house movie theater, to two large temporary exhibition spaces that house some of the biggest touring shows to visit Santiago. Upstairs contains a fair-trade



crafts shop, a few cafes, and a gallery space. The former parking lot of the presidential palace was transformed into a wide plaza, and the multi-storey gallery was built to host some of the most important art exhibitions in Chile, as well as the National Film Archive and the Digital Library. The gallery showcases both classical and contemporary art from all over the world.

Plaza de Armas



Plaza de Armas was twice the size of the modern-day plaza that occupies the land today and was home to regular meditation ceremonies that were performed by Inca nobility. These ceremonies typically ended in tears, giving the original square the name Huacaypata, which translates to “place of crying”. While

the Spanish greatly transformed Huacaypata, destroying native temples and buildings and replacing them with churches and mansions, the site has remained an important hub of social, political, and religious life for the people of Cusco, particularly as they fought for freedom from their Spanish oppressors. Plaza de Armas is anchored by two of the city’s most well-known religious buildings: the Church La Compañía de Jesús and the Cathedral Basilica of the Assumption of the Virgin.

Cerro Santa Lucia

Cerro Santa Lucia, which is a park built on a hill located in the center of the city. At 69 meters high, this hill provides one of the loveliest views of the city. It was just a rocky hill until 19th-century mayor Benjamín Vicuña Mackenna had it transformed into one of the city's most memorable green spaces. A web of trails and steep stone stairs leads you through terraces to the Torre Mirador at the top, and there are a scattering of chapels and other interesting buildings in between. There's a free elevator to the top if you want to save your legs.



Barrio Lastarria



Center for cultural activity, with cinemas, theaters, museums, restaurants, and bars. Its cobblestone streets and European architecture are nestled in between the busy downtown core. If you are lucky you can even catch a free professional classical music in the streets, explore an installation, or even walk by an outdoor screening of a local film. The numerous smaller streets branching off have more shops, bars, and eye-catching street art.

Barrio Bellavista

Bellavista is a neighborhood with various attributes that define an identity marked by art, culture, and bohemia. In its streets artistic manifestations are carried out, from dance, song, theater interventions and the presence of murals and artistic expressions on the facades of the houses. Bellavista has been the cradle of artistic and cultural development in Santiago, and to this day, in the neighborhood there are theater schools, urban dance schools, art and design galleries, artists' workshops, music rooms and framing workshops.



Bicentenario Park



This modern park is located in the heart of the Vitacura community, bordering the south side of the Mapocho river. It has quality food vendors and entertainers, a large man-made lagoon, featuring lengthy boardwalks and beautiful views of water and the city skyline. It is also home to dozens of black-neck swans and other unusual fowl and fish, which can be fed by visitors. This lagoon takes up

much of the Southern half of the park, alongside multi-leveled grassy fields, and gardens.

Palacio de Tribunales de Justicia

The current building was built between 1905 and 1930, with strong French influence. Its main facade occupies the entire length of the block. It has reinforced brick masonry walls. Inside it has a three-story high hall that crosses the building along its entire length, with side corridors that connect the rooms. It is covered by a striking metal and glass vault. Beautiful is the large stained glass window brought from Germany, which shows different landscapes



Centro Cultural Gabriela Mistral GAM



This striking cultural and performing-arts center named for Chilean poet Gabriela Mistral, the first Latin American woman to win the Nobel Prize in Literature – is an exciting addition to Santiago's art scene, with concerts and performances most days. Drop by to check out the rotating art exhibits on the bottom floor, the iconic architecture that vaults and cantilevers on the inside and looks like a giant rusty cheese grater from the street, the little plazas, murals, cafes and more

Cajon Del Maipo



We arrive to the Maipo Valley known for its lush vineyards and various local shops that sell homemade bread, honey and crafts. From there, we will continue the road until reaching the mountain town of San Alfonso. This location is home to vast parklands, rugged terrains, waterfalls and amazing hiking trails. It is the ideal place to relax and unwind. As optional activity

with an extra fee, you could experience a horseback riding or zip line. There is also a nearby pool, where you can go to soak up the sun and contemplate our pristine surroundings

Valparaíso

Enjoy the beauty and charm of the city of Valparaíso, declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. Here we will ride a funicular, one of the town's typical cable-car that connects the center of the city with the colorful hills. At the top of Cerro Concepción, we will visit the Atkinson and Gervasoni walks, where we will be able to



experience the cultural spirit of Valparaíso, with its street art and music. We will continue our journey towards Plaza Sotomayor, a significant highlight where we will find a monument to the Iquique Combat and the Pacific War. We will then make our way to Viña del Mar, also known as the garden city, famous for its fascinating natural beauty, lifestyle, and cuisine. We will walk along the waterfront and visit the city's major attractions including the parks, statues, and gardens.

Ahu Akivi

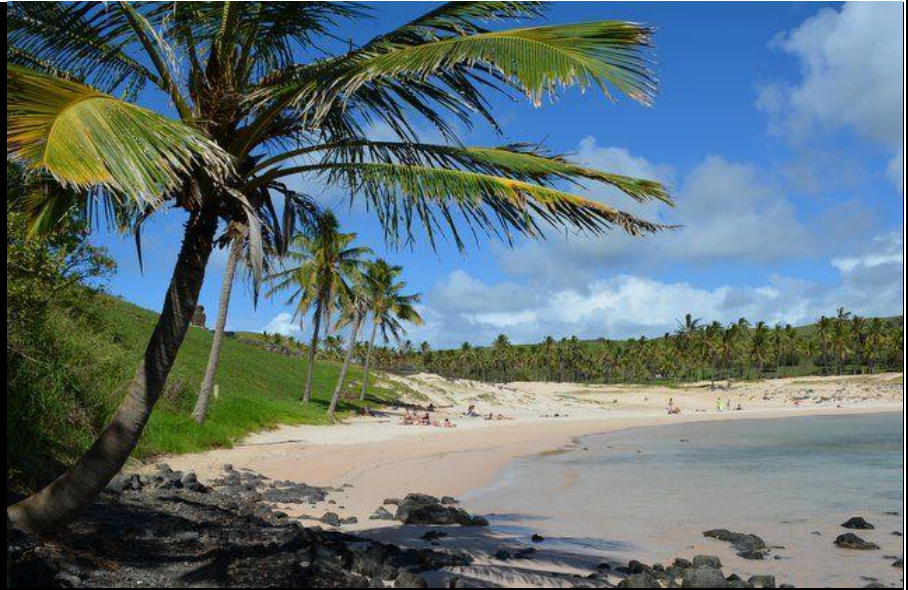


moais, now knocked down and facing the ground, used to stand. Continuing our journey, we will drive to the quarry Puna Pau, a crater of red Scoria stone, from which the Pukaos were created.

Built in the middle of the island. The legend tells us that these statues are representing the 7 explorers who were sent to Rapa Nui by the king Hotu Matua. We will leave the town of Hanga Roa and drive through beautiful hills to our first stop, the ceremonial place of Tahai. This archaeological site forms an integral part of the Rapa Nui National Park and was designated a World Heritage site by UNESCO. We will proceed to the unrestored Ahu Hanga Poukura where we can see a huge platform where the

Anakena Beach

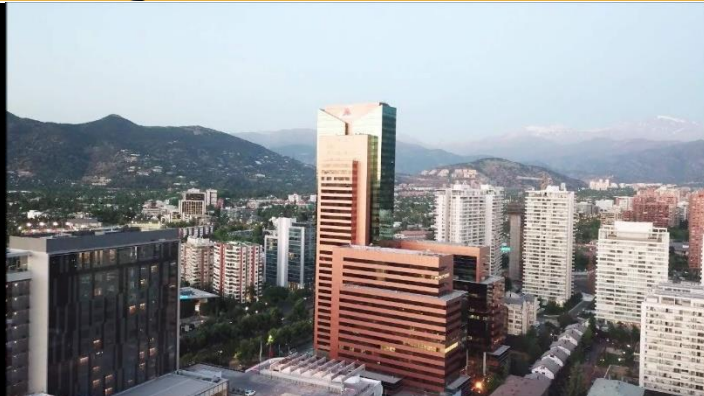
Leaving the town of Hanga Roa behind and drive along the black coastline, accompanied by great views of the peninsula Poike. Our first stop will be the archaeological site Vaihu, where we will have a look at the remains of this ahu and will learn more about why all moai here face the ground. Passing several sculptures lying on the side of the road. Once we reached Ranu Raraku (the quarry where all moai were sculpted) we will have a delicious picnic lunch, before



starting your ascent to the correspondent volcano. Here more than 300 statues can be appreciated, some of them half-carved, many broken, but all will give us an insight in the incredible culture of Rapa Nui. From the edge of the volcano we can also enjoy the view of a crater-lake. We will make another cultural stop at the recently reinstalled Ahu Tongariki and its 15 moai, before taking a small break at the beautiful Anakena beach. The white sandy seaside with coconut palm trees and the blue cove of warm pacific water make it a true paradise. Here we can relax on the beach, go for a swim in the nice water or discover two more Ahus, one of them particularly interesting because of the moais'
