About Tanzania

Entry Requirements

To enter Tanzania as a US Citizen, you must have a passport, valid 6 months past the date of entry.

You are required to apply for your Tanzanian visa prior to entry. You can apply for your visa at either the NY Mission or DC Embassy.

The cost for a single-entry visa is \$50 and \$100 for a double entry. If you are doing the Kilimanjaro Itinerary or Seychelles extension, a double entry visa is required.

Shots/Vaccines

Proof of Yellow Fever vaccination is only required if you've recently traveled to a yellow fever endemic country.

For Malaria, talk to your doctor about how to prevent malaria while traveling. You may need to take prescription medicine before, during, and after your trip to prevent malaria, especially if you are visiting low-altitude areas.

About Rwanda

Entry Requirements

To enter Rwanda as a US Citizen, you must have a passport, valid 6 months past the date of entry.

Visas can be purchased for \$30 at the port of entry.

Shots/Vaccines

Proof of Yellow Fever vaccination IS required in order to enter Rwanda

For Malaria, talk to your doctor about how to prevent malaria while traveling. You may need to take prescription medicine before, during, and after your trip to prevent malaria, especially if you are visiting low-altitude areas.

About Uganda

Entry Requirements

To enter Rwanda as a US Citizen, you must have a passport, valid 6 months past the date of entry.

Visas MUST be purchased in advanced. Visas can be purchased online for \$50 by going [HERE](#)

Shots/Vaccines

Proof of Yellow Fever vaccination IS required to enter Uganda.

For Malaria, talk to your doctor about how to prevent malaria while traveling. You may need to take prescription medicine before, during, and after your trip to prevent malaria, especially if you are visiting low-altitude areas.

Trekking for Gorillas

Tracking activity in this area is rated fairly strenuous and requires that the client should be in good physical shape. If you are not sure of your fitness you can hire a porter and pay him a tip to help you along.

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IN DEPTH

Day tour of Mt. Kilimanjaro Area (Materuni)

After arriving and taking in the beautiful views of Mt. Kilimanjaro, go on a moderate hike of approximately 40 minutes to the beautiful Materuni waterfall with an English speaking guide. Along the way learn about local village life and enjoy the beauty of nature. Learn about different types of flora and fauna. Get a chance to test chagga local banana beer, Bring a swimsuit and towel and take a relaxing dip in the natural pool at the base of the falls. After the waterfall view and enjoy a demonstration of the traditional coffee processing techniques and learn some local songs in the process, finally enjoy a cup of organic Materuni coffee.



Kilimanjaro 1st Base Upgrade



You certainly can't climb Kilimanjaro in a day, but our day tour to this iconic, snow-capped mountain will give you an excellent taster of why Africa's highest peak is so popular. During the course of the day, we will follow the popular Marangu Route and walk as far as the first hut – the Mandara – where our picnic lunch will be taken. As other trekkers continue upwards, bound for the summit, we will make the descent again and return to Arusha.

While others will spend their first night there, on this trip we will use Mandara simply for a rest point before we return down the mountain. We start our climb at 1900 metres above sea-level, and trek uphill, through rainforest and with a glimpse perhaps of some blue monkeys. At these lower altitudes, there are good opportunities to observe a wonderful variety of mammals, birds, insects and plant-life, including towering eucalyptus trees and Colobus monkeys. Our highpoint at Mandara will be 2720 metres, our total walking time can be up to 6.5 hours (return journey). The rainforest is the chief feature of today's landscape. Look out also for the bright red impatiens kilimanjari flower, a symbol of the mountain. At the end of the climb, we see giant heathers and bearded lichen for the first time.

Maasi Cultural Tour



An estimated 450,000 Maasai people live in the rural plains of Tanzania, where their nomadic life and long history as herders have made them one of the most famous tribes in all of Africa. Even as Kenya and Tanzania—two East African countries the Maasai call home—move towards industrialization, their governments have worked hard to develop social and anthropological programs to protect their traditional way of life.

Travelers to game reserves, scrublands and Tanzanian deserts can easily find Maasai settlements where lanky men and women dressed in brilliant red robes welcome outsiders to learn more about their lifestyle, community and culture. The Maasai are a patriarchal people, where elder males act as decision makers on matters that impact the village. Boys are sent out to the pasture to keep watch over the cows as soon as they can walk and girls are required to maintain the household. One of the core tenants of the group is a practice called “amitu”—a term that means, “to make peace.” It’s an important part of the Maasai tradition and asks that each member make reparations for any wrongdoing to his or her peers.

While Maasai communities, often called bomas, exist throughout Tanzania, it’s easy to include a visit to one of these communities on a trip to the Ngorongoro Conservation Area. Close to 43,000 Maasai live alongside Africa’s wildlife in this protected area, where they practice their pastoral life, looking after goats, sheep, cattle and donkeys. Two main bomas—one on the way to the Serengeti, and another closer to Sopa Lodge at Irkeepusi Village—welcome travelers looking to learn more about the culture and practices of this ancient tribe.

Ngorongoro Crater Safari



An unforgettable visit to Ngorongoro Crater, a conservation area for over 50 years and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, too. This is the world’s largest volcanic caldera and your driver-guide will point out the diverse vegetation which can be found here: grassland, forest and swamp. Here lives a population of more than 25,000 large mammals, including elephant, lion, leopard, hyena, jackal, water-buck and baboons, all taking advantage of the year-round water supply. You might even spot

a rare black rhino, with a bit of luck – and the help of the excellent eyesight of your driver-guide!

Hunting w/ the Hadzabe



Spend the day with the Hadzabe people, ancient hunter-gatherers who inhabit the land near Lake Eyasi, a gorgeous soda lake that's part of the Great Rift Valley of East Africa, and witness their unchanged, traditional way of life and harmony with the earth. Accompanied throughout by an &Beyond ranger, guests have the opportunity to engage with the Bushmen and learn all about their time-honoured hunting techniques, survival skills, food preparation and cultural norms. A veritable step back in time, this is an undeniably authentic cultural journey into rural

Tanzania that reveals the untold world of these charismatic people.

Morning w/ The Datoga

These pastoralists are also skilled silversmith's who live near the Hadzabe and supply them with iron tips, knives and spears in exchange for honey and fruits. Their origins are the Horn of Africa thought to have immigrated some 3,000 years ago. They wear traditional dress decorated in coloured beads and the women often have facial scarification for beauty.



Kikuletwa hot springs



The hot springs of Kikuletwa, also known as Chemka Hot Springs, are close to the village of Rundugai and are one of the most beautiful places in Tanzania to relax. The small pond is surrounded by palm and fig trees with winding roots. In the morning, Blue Monkeys can often be observed in the trees, whilst the crystal clear, turquoise water invites you to a refreshing bath. Although they are called hot springs, the water in Kikuletwa is not truly 'hot' but refreshing, as the water source is fed by Kilimanjaro itself.

Enjoy a wonderful day in just the way you want, in the sun dozing, chatting with the locals at the small bar, or swimming - you determine the course of this day. At noon we will have a picnic lunch, and in the late afternoon we return relaxed to Arusha

Stone Town Day Tour

Visit the historic Stone Town of Zanzibar, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, on a guided, half-day tour from Zanzibar. With an experienced guide to lead the way, you'll explore a blend of African, Arab, Indian, Persian, and European cultures, following narrow streets shaded by elegant balconies and verandahs. See the former slave market, the Sultan Palace, and a series of beautifully-carved wooden doors, with a 30-minute shopping break to browse for some of Zanzibar's most distinctive souvenirs.



While wandering through the old city of Stone Town listen closely to our guide's sagas and tales of Zanzibar's most popular inhabitants among them Princess Salme, Farrokh Bulsara and Bi Kidude and follow their footsteps of past. This half day historical city tour includes the visit to the Darajani Town Market, the former Slave Market, Forodhani Gardens with view to the House of Wonders, Sultan Palace, Old Fort and much more worth exploring. For those who would like to do some souvenir shopping your guide will show you some art, craft and souvenir shops and teach you how to bargain the best prices.

Safari Blue



The tour starts on the Fumba Peninsula, a twenty-minute drive from Stone Town. It is advisable to wear shorts and water-shoes too as you may have to wade when boarding and disembarking your vessel and there are sea urchins and painful coral along the sea bed. The trip takes you to a sandbank, cold soft drinks and beers are provided en route. From this bank you can snorkel. Guides set up a shade tent in which you can have a snack or a cool drink. The snorkeling is good and the location peaceful. If you are lucky you may spy some dolphins while sailing.

After this the boat sets off to a second beach location. Guides set up the extensive and fresh seafood BBQ while you relax on the beach. Dinner is followed by a beach walk to a fallen Baobab tree that serves as a climbing frame. Finally the boat sails round to a mangrove glade and there is final swimming among the trees before the day is done.

4 Day Serengeti Great Migration Experience

Day 1



You will arrive in the central region of the Serengeti after a quick 2 hour flight. Your first game drive follows in the morning where you will see great herds of buffalo, smaller groups of elephant and giraffe, and thousands of eland, topi, kongoni, impala and gazelle among other exotic animals. Afterwards, you'll proceed to the Lodge for your dinner and accommodation.

Day 2

The second day is dedicated to a full day game drive while traveling to the northern Serengeti region, along the way seeing elusive lions, leopards, elephants, cheetah, buffalo, zebra, wildebeest, eland, wild dog, gazelles, and crocodiles among others.



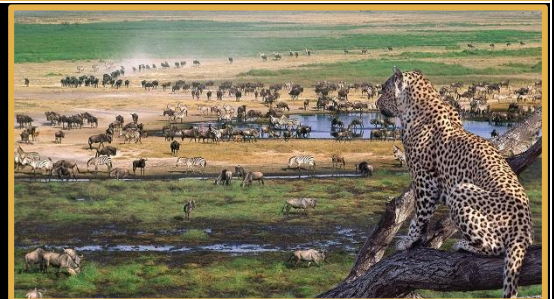
Day 3



Your third day will be spent on a Full day game drive in North Serengeti in pursuit of the great wildebeest Migration! The wildebeest will birth more than 8,000 calves daily before the 1,000 km (600 mile) pilgrimage begins again.

Day 4

Your final day will be spent doing one final morning game drive before catching a flight back to Arusha.



Gorilla Trekking

Early morning transfer to the park head trail for briefing before entering the gorilla sanctuary. The tracking activity starts at 8 am. Come along with proper trekking shoes, back pack, water, lunch, camera, mosquito repellants, rain jacket and light sweater. Tracking activity in this area is rated fairly strenuous and requires that the client should be in good physical shape. If you are not sure of your fitness you can hire a porter and pay him a tip to help you along. It is unpredictable how long you might take to find the primates as they freely move into the forest. However, once finding them, you are allowed one hour for watching and photography a rewarding and unforgettable experience. Return to the lodge for dinner and overnight.



Kigali Day Tour



With Kigali City Sightseeing you'll discover different parts of Kigali city with a professional and friendly local tour guide. The areas for the city sightseeing include Gahanga local market, Uzuri K&Y workshop for made in Rwanda sandals, Akagera; the river separating Kigali from the Eastern province and which will pass through Akagera National Park to separate Rwanda and Tanzania. This river continues its way into Victoria lake and further to form Nile river. The city tour passes via Rebero, where there is a view overlooking the central part of Kigali city and the Kigali Conventional Centre in the horizon and goes on to Kigali Heights-one of the modern shopping and entertainment centres, Nyamirambo area-one of the oldest suburbs of Kigali city, the car free zone for lunch, Ubumwe Grande Hotel rooftop bar for an afternoon coffee, and Kigali Genocide Memorial.
