Payment Arrangements

- Your \$200 deposit is due Aug 15th. Your deposit is only \$100 when you use the code “BaobabJuice” when checking out by Aug 1st.
- Your first monthly payment will be collected Aug 30th. Each of the subsequent payments will be collected the 30th of each month and on the 15th in July, for a total of 12 payments.

Refund Policy

- Your deposit is fully refundable for 15 days after it has been paid, or until Aug 30th, whichever comes first.
- 50% of your deposit can be applied to a future trip within a years' time of this trip being cancelled.
- Each monthly payment becomes non-refundable 30 days after the due date for that payment.
- The trip becomes 100% non-refundable on/after July 15th.
- All trips are non-transferrable
- Refunds can take up to 30 days from the date it is requested.
- In the event we are not able to visit our main desired destination (Madagascar) for any reason, our only recourse is to postpone to a later date(s). If you are unable to attend the new dates, we will offer you the option to go anytime on your own. Any request to cancel under this circumstance will abide by our above refund/cancellation policy.

Entry Requirements

PASSPORT:

You must have a U.S. passport valid 6 month past the date of entry with 3 blank pages.

VISA:

All visitors to Madagascar are required to get a visa to enter the country. Besides getting visa from an embassy or consulate in advance, foreign visitors can also obtain visa online or on arrival. The cost of the visa on Arrival is roughly \$37. You MUST pay using cash, cards are not accepted

Shots/Vaccines

Yellow fever, if traveler has been in a yellow fever endemic country within 6 months of arrival

Weather

Daily high temperatures are around 74°F, rarely falling below 63°F.

IN DEPTH

Morondava



Morondava is a town on Madagascar's west coast. It's the gateway to the Avenue of the Baobabs, where massive baobab trees tower over the landscape. Nearby, Kirindy Forest is home to lemurs and carnivorous, catlike fossas. Farther north, Tsingy de Bemaraha National Park has jagged limestone pinnacles connected by rope bridges and walkways. South of the city, ships are built by hand on Belo sur Mer's sandy lagoon.

Kirindy National Reserve

Kirindy is the best place in the whole island to observe fossa. It also home to seven species of lemur. The most common are the common brown lemurs and the Verreaux's sifakas. These long-legged, seven-pound lemurs, white with dark patches, leap among tree trunks high in the canopy, propelled by their powerful hind legs but continually maintaining an upright posture. The remaining species are nocturnal: the rare Coquerel's giant mouse lemur and pygmy mouse-lemur, fork-crowned lemur, Gray mouse lemur, western fat-tailed dwarf lemur and red-tailed sportive lemur. Several bats, tenrecs, mongooses and rodents complete the mammal population. 40 bird, 50 reptile and 15 amphibian species are also found in this magnificent forest.



Bekopaka



Bekopaka is a town and commune in western Madagascar. It belongs to the district of Antsalova, which is a part of Melaky Region. The population of the commune was estimated to be approximately 9,000 in 2001. Passing through the dry deciduous forest, you will also embark your vehicle on barges to cross bridge-less rivers while enjoying the view and everything Bekopaka has to offer. We will cross the river to Belon'i Tsiribihina a town and commune in Madagascar that belongs to the

district of Belo sur Tsiribihina, which is a part of Menabe Region, where we will have lunch and interact with locals..

Tsingy de Bemaraha National Park

Perfectly laid out by Madagascar National Park, depending on the capacity of the visitors, the Bemaraha National Park offers hiking circuits but also sportier treks. Visitors will contemplate the magic of the genesis of the Tsingy by circulating in the canyons, advancing through the labyrinths and touching their walls. They will feel the emptiness by the climb to the roof of the Tsingy and will admire the overview of the Tsingy and the differences in vegetation from the lookouts. They will also visit the pretty caves containing testimonies of ancient human presences and showing the different forms of concretions.



The big Tsingy is probably the most rewarding day in the park because it penetrates deep into the limestone forest through the suspension bridges with the impressive karst formations underfoot. The track is not technically difficult and even children can cope with it, but you should definitely not suffer from vertigo! The downward gaze of the suspension bridge is something to be avoided for easily passed out.

Visitors can spot 11 species of lemurs, including Decken's sifaka, red-fronted brown lemur, fatty tailed lemur, gray mouse lemur or Cleese woolly lemur and bamboo lemur, which do occur here. The other resident mammals are the small carnivorous falanouc and the ring-tailed mongoose, as well as several bats.

More than 100 species of birds have been listed inside the national park, including the critically endangered Madagascar fish eagle and the crested ibis, the Madagascar railing, the coua giant or Coquerel's coua.

The 45 reptiles and amphibians found there are all endemic. Some important species that are only found in Bemaraha are the Madagascar iguana, a long-tailed skink.

Bring good walking shoes and comfortable, breathable clothing. These circuits are organized and adapted according to the duration you want, and your level

Avenue of the Baobabs



Enjoy the sunset and legend of baobabs in love where two twisted together and became a natural monument. The Avenue of the Baobabs, or Alley of the Baobabs, is a prominent group of Grandidier's baobabs lining the dirt road between Morondava and Belon'i Tsiribihina in the Menabe region.

These giant, dry season-deciduous trees, members of the Mallow family, many of which are more than 800 years old with trunks that are over 150 feet

around did not always stand alone. At one time the trees dotting the lane were part of a rich forest of the trees and other plants, but the encroachment of modern civilization and increasing populations in the area led to massive deforestation leaving the remaining baobabs to stand in relative isolation

Antananarivo



Antananarivo is the capital city of Madagascar, in the island's Central Highlands. Optional visit of the lower and upper town which is the ancient city. Overlooking the city, the Rova of Antananarivo palace complex was the center of the Merina kingdom from the 17th century. It features wooden houses and royal tombs. The pink baroque Andafiavaratra Palace sits in the nearby Haute Ville neighborhood in the Blue Hills. In the city center, heart-shaped Lake Anosy is ringed by jacaranda trees.

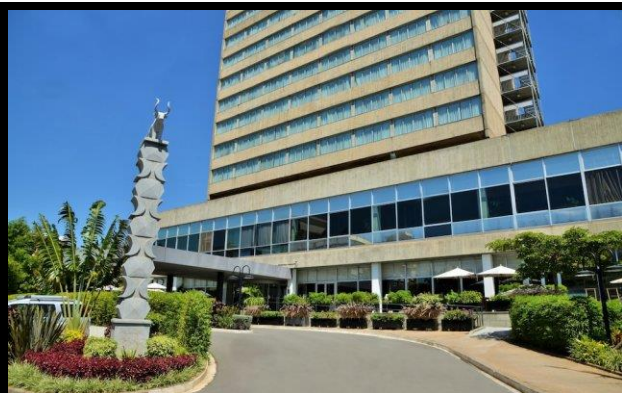
Ambohimanga

The Royal Hill of Ambohimanga consists of a royal city and burial site, and an ensemble of sacred places. It is associated with strong feelings of national identity, and has maintained its spiritual and sacred character both in ritual practice and the popular imagination for the past 500 years. It remains a place of worship to which pilgrims come from Madagascar and elsewhere.
