BUT WHERE IN AFRICA?

If you are at all familiar with AAT, you know one of the many goals that we aim to accomplish with each trip is to go where very few like us have gone, and gain experiences so unique and awe-inspiring that upon your return, you will give off such



a glow that the site of you alone will inspire others around you to want to go out and gain the same experience. In order to satisfy this goal, we have decided to focus our trip at the sight of one of the seven natural wonders of the world and premiere adventure destination, Victoria Falls in Livingstone, Zambia.

But Wait! If you are in fact familiar with AAT, you know we also aim to take in as much and gain as many passport from a given area as we can! For that reason, travelers will be given, along with the plethora of activities to choose from in Zambia (white water rafting or bungie jumping anyone?), the option to visit neighboring Chobe, Botswana and Victoria Falls (town), Zimbabwe on day trips and stay for a 3 day extension in Johannesburg, South Africa.



THINGS TO KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

ZAMBIA:

Zambia Passport Requirements

A passport and visa are required to enter Zambia. Your passport must be valid 6 months after the intended date of departure from Zambia and have at least 2 blank pages.

Zambia Visa Requirements

A single entry visa may be obtained at a port of entry for \$50. A multiple entry visa can be purchased for \$80.

Risk of Yellow Fever and Vaccination Requirement

As of February 2015, the World Health Organization (WHO) determined that the risk of contracting yellow fever in Zambia is low. For this reason, you are not required to get a yellow fever vaccine to enter Zambia or into any country visited on this trip.

Departure Tax

Upon departure, each traveler will be required to pay a \$25 departure tax at the airport.

Languages

English is widely spoken in Livingstone

Tipping

For a meal it is customary to leave 10%; for small services such as hotel porters carrying your bags, tip \$1 to \$3.

Safety

Travel in Livingstone and most other major cities in Zambia is generally safe during daylight hours.

Carjacking remains an ongoing problem throughout Zambia, including Livingstone. Drivers are advised to lock their car doors, close their windows, and remain vigilant when entering or exiting a residence.

Travelers using public transportation or visiting high pedestrian traffic areas are advised to be vigilant against robbery and pick-pocketing.

The Number for Emergencies

The local equivalent to the '911' emergency line in Zambia is '999'.

Police/ Ambulance is 991

LGBT Rights

Consensual same-sex sexual relations are criminalized in Zambia, and the law provides penalties of 15 years to life imprisonment. Although, in general, non-Zambians have not been targeted for LGBT actives, the political and cultural environment is hostile towards LGBT persons.

Accessibility

While in Zambia, individuals with disabilities may find accessibility and accommodations very difficult. If you are someone who has special needs, please let us know in advance so we can make the necessary accommodations.

Currency

The local currency in Zambia is the Kwacha. Check with you back for the most up to date exchange rate as it fluctuates regularly.

ATMS

ATMS are available throughout Livingstone. However, some only accept Visa! Keep this in mind If you are traveling with American Express or MasterCard.

Driving Conditions

In Zambia, vehicles drive on the left side of the road, it is illegal to turn left on a red light. Driving on Zambian roads can be hazardous, as most roads do not have shoulders or sidewalks.

HIV/AIDS

The infections rate in Zambia is around 14%, which translates to one in every 8 people in the country being infected with HIV.

Religion

75% of Zambians are Christian, the majority are members of one of the hundreds of protestant churches. There is also a significant Muslim population

Treatment of Women

Women travelers in Zambia will generally not encounter gender related problems any more than they might in other parts of the world. However, be aware when it comes to evening entertainment, Zambia is a conservative, male dominated society. In bars where women are 'allowed', cultural conventions often dictate that you don't go in without a male companion


Water

Tap water is generally considered safe, but you may be better off drinking the bottled water provided in your hotel room, because local water is less processed and may be richer in mineral content than your stomach is used to.

Certain over-the-counter medication, such as the antihistamine Benadryl, may not be brought into the country without permission.

Any prescription medicine should be carried in the original container with a written prescription from your physician.

The cruise ends at around 12h30 and you are taken to one of the riverbank hotels for lunch. Although with Zambia, 80% of the river cascades in the gorge on the Zimbabwean side. When in full flow, more than 500 million litres of water tumble over this 1.7km-wide precipice every minute, providing a full-frontal assault on the senses. Also enjoy the wildlife and many rainbows that form over the falls.

This is a small town, focused primarily as one would expect, on tourists. So there is an array curios shops, arts and crafts, galleries and little boutiques and tasty restaurants. There are plenty of hotels and in each of these hotels there is normally a couple of curio shops, these shops are invariably quite pricey. So it's a good idea to have a stroll around the town to see what else is on offer. From one



end of town to the other is no more than one Kilometer so it is very easy within a short walk to have covered the whole of the town center.

3:30 PM Visit the Jafuta Heritage Center

This small museum at Elephant's Walk houses a private collection of material cultural and visual Zimbabwean artifacts. It allows the visitor to explore some of the tribes and history of the country and if they wish, to discuss aspects of this with our curator, Ephraim Sithole who is also the local Nyanga and he can throw the bones for you as well! here are beautifully presented displays on the Shona, Ndebele and Tonga peoples, accompanied with items of cultural artifacts, some going back many hundreds of years.

Helicopter Rides over the falls

Cost: \$175 for 15 Min/ \$340 for 30 min

An opportunity to witness the Zambezi river metamorphosis from a genteel and meandering river to turbulent raging rapids as the river, 1,7km wide at the Victoria Falls tumbles 120m before being compressed by a steep granite gorge a mere 40m wide.



Horse Trails

Cost: 2 Hours for \$80/ \$115 for ½ day

Riding into the teak forests and wilderness areas, crossing over rivers and camping out along the banks of the river is one of the better ways to enjoy the awesome beauty of this area



Gwembe Crocodile Farm

Cost: \$40

Livingstone Reptile Park boasts a collection of Livingstone's most notorious reptiles. Our crocodiles have been rescued from the Zambezi River where they were posing a danger to both humans and themselves. Gwembe Safaris were asked to capture these animals to prevent any further threat to people or their livestock. Had we not done so they could have been destroyed. Getting close to these animals never ceases to invoke feelings of fascination, respect and fear.



Canoeing

Canoeing Safari on the Upper Zambezi River, is a wonderfully relaxing way to enjoy the astonishingly beautiful scenery that lines the river before it takes its plunge over the Victoria Falls. This part of the river is dotted with many islands of varying size; home to many birds and small animals. This is the route David Livingstone took on his way in search of the rising clouds of mist. It was in fact along these banks that he remarked "scenes so lovely must have been gazed upon by angels in their flight"



Visit the Hector Pierterson Memorial



You are permitted to have 1 carryon item under 17.6 lbs w dimensions of 22in (L), 14in (W), 9in (H). Additionally, one (1) small personal item (e.g. small purse, small laptop case) is also allowed.



Larger laptop bags and standard/bulkier briefcases will NOT be considered a personal item and will count as a normal piece of cabin baggage, which may not exceed one piece in economy and two in premium (subject to dimension & weight restrictions).

It is highly recommended that all travelers pack light toiletries in a carry-on bag (wet wipes, toothbrush, etc.) due to the length of travel time before final arrival at the hotel in Zambia. Be sure to review airline restrictions for liquids in carry-ons

Checked Bags:

You are permitted to have 2 pieces at a maximum of 50lbs per piece and maximum dimension of 62inches per piece. Passengers are required to re-pack their baggage if the baggage weight exceeds the limitation per piece as the baggage over 70lb will not be accepted and must be shipped separately as freight or cargo.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

There will be countless Q&As and meet and greets between now and departure to answer any question that may arise about this trip. Below you will find answers to questions about AAT and our approach to managing your trip.

HOW MUCH DOES THIS TRIP COST EXACTLY?

Good questions! Throughout this packet I'm sure you saw that certain excursions had an indication that they cost extra, which I'm sure just caused confusion.

To answer the question, with this trip you get:

- 7 days/6 night's accommodation at the Protea Hotel Livingstone
- Transfers to/from the hotel in Livingstone
- Zambezi Dinner Cruise

HOW DO WE MAKE PAYMENTS?

There is a deposit of \$300 due February 29th, after **which** there is a manageable monthly payment of \$491.66 due the 15th of every month between March and September. After making your deposit, the monthly payments will be automatically withdrawn from your account.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I MISS A PAYMENT?

It happens to all of us! And we more than understand! If the automatic withdrawal fails on the 15th, we will try again each of the following 3 days (16th, 17th, and 18th). If we are not able to process a payment on any of those days, we will reach out to you and attempt to work out an arraignment to get you caught up! If one cannot be arraigned then you were will be refunded based upon our refund policy.

WHAT'S THE REFUND POLICY?

The policy is simple and one I'm sure you will find quite agreeable!

- Your deposit is 100% refundable up until the day before the first monthly payment is due, which would be March 15th. After that, your deposit is non-refundable.
- Each payment received after March 15th is fully refundable up until the midway point, which is June 15th.
- After June 15th All payments made before that become non-refundable, all payments made afterwards and prior to the departure date are fully refundable
- After October 15th, the trip is non-refundable. If you are in need of a refund, you will need to consult your travel insurance.

HOW DO THESE ADD ONS WORK?

Even better question! In planning each trip to this point, it has become abundantly apparent that while everyone enjoys traveling in a group, everyone does not want to be forced to do EVERYTHING that the rest of the group is doing. For that reason, we approached the trip with the idea of creating one that is modular and highly customizable!

I say all that to say, the way it works is when you go to make your deposit, you will be presented with options for several add ons. If one happens to tickle your fancy, you can select it and it will be divided amongst your monthly payments. Your deposit will remain the same \$200, but your trip will be tailored made to suit your every expectation!

WHAT IF I DON'T HAVE SOMEONE TO BRING WITH ME? DO I HAVE TO SELECT A SINGLE OCCUPANCY ROOM?

While the option is there for you to get a single occupancy room if your choose, by no means do you have to select it if traveling alone. We understand that the extra money spent in getting your own room, takes away from the money available to you to splurge on the streets Livingstone. For that reason, we extend each traveler the option of having us pair you with a suitable roommate for no additional cost. Roommates are paired based upon the answers to their personality questions on their registration form, as well as their ages and even astrological signs.
