Nairobi Day Tour

Elephant Orphanage



Get the chance to feed, play and interact with these beautiful creatures up close and personal. Best known for its Orphans' Project, the first and most successful elephant orphan rescue and rehabilitation program in the world. Not only working to protect elephants from its biggest threats to its survival due to ivory poaching, human-wildlife conflict and habitat destruction, but protecting the entire ecosystems and the diverse flora and fauna sustained in these places of stunning natural beauty.

Giraffe Orphanage

The orphanage began after discovering the sad plight of the Rothschild Giraffe. A subspecies of the giraffe found only in the grasslands of East Africa. Also known for being world-famous as a Nature Education Centre, educating thousands of Kenyan school children every year. While educating giving local and international visitors an opportunity to come into close contact with the world's tallest species, the giraffe.



Britam Skyscraper



Enjoy the view of Kenya from the top of Britam Tower that is the first skyscraper in Africa to feature in the top ten Emporis Skyscraper Award's list. It made its way to the tenth position among other outstanding skyscrapers in the world, the skyscraper has a maximum height of 195 metres.

Pokot Tribe

The Pokot do not live in villages. Each family group lives in a boma, a small clearing in the acacia woodland. In a typical boma there could be an extended family of over 20 people although most family groups are smaller than this. The huts of the married women are built in a circle inside a thick thorn hedge. The huts are arranged in order of seniority. Men and women wear adornments as signifiers of class, gender, or wealth. The Pokot are one of Kenya's last untouched tribes.



Njemps Tribe



Njemps live around Lake Baringo, in a place called Marigat. They speak Maa language and belong to the plain Nilotes linguistic group, like the Maasai, Samburu and Turkana communities. The Njemps have long practiced farming and fishing. They keep small herds of cattle, goats and sheep. They also gather honey from large tree trunks. Men traditionally also engaged in hunting game, to supplement their diet, but hunting is illegal in Kenya today. They make clothes and ornaments from leather, beads,

brass, and copper among other items. Different clothes and ornaments are worn to indicate status among members of the community.

Luo Tribe

The Luo are the fourth largest ethnic group in Kenya. They speak 'Dholuo' which is part of the Nilotic language group. Known as 'Ramogi's descendants,' the Luo community are particularly known for their musical skills and instruments. All Luo leaders wore special regalia and had special items which portrayed their status including headdresses, a spear, special robes, a flywhisk and a stool. Notable Luos include: the former Prime Minister of Kenya, Raila Odinga; the former president of the United States of America, Barack Obama



Maasai Tribe

The Maasai have always been special. Their bright red robes set them apart visually. Spear in hand, they are calm and courageous regardless of the danger. They are one of the very few tribes who have retained most of their traditions, lifestyle, and lore. In common with the wildlife with which they co-exist. Unlike many other tribes in Kenya, the Maasai are seminomadic and pastoral, they live by herding cattle and goats. Rivers and springs supply fresh water to more than 7 million people living in and around the port city of Mombasa, Kenya's second largest city.




Hot Air Balloon Safari



Feast your eyes on the golden sunrise, enchanting sceneries, plains-game below as the winds gently blows the basket deeper into the reserve. The pilot is on standby pointing out the wildlife below with plenty of photographic opportunities unfolding. The Mara is the northernmost part of the spectacular Serengeti-Mara ecosystem, home to the "Great Migration" and scores of other wildlife. including lions. cheetahs, elephants, rhinos, hippos, and crocodiles.


Masai Mara Game Drive



Game drives are designed to take you close to the wildlife rich spots in the Maasai Mara. This gives you an opportunity to view wild animals in their natural habitat as they go about their daily activities. As you drive into the wilderness, you will be captivated by the vast beauty of the savanna, with its rolling hills and infinite horizon. You most certainly will encounter the big five: lion,

cheetah, rhino, leopard, and elephant, as well as numerous other wildlife animals and birds, with no fences or man-made barriers, wildlife can move freely throughout this area, constantly recreating an ageless natural cycle.

Mombasa Day Tour



Learn, eat, and meet history and locals of Mombasa, a melting pot of languages and cultures from all sides of the Indian Ocean. Mombasa has two ports, Mombasa Old Port on the island's east side and Kilindini Harbour on the west. The old port is now used only by dhows and small craft, bringing trade from Arabia, the Persian Gulf, and India. The old city is strongly Middle Eastern, with narrow streets, high houses with carved ornamental balconies, and mosques and temples.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Nairobi Hotel



Set in the business district, this upscale, contemporary hotel is 4.8 km from Nairobi Arboretum and 17 km from Nairobi National Park a wildlife preserves with herds of zebras, wildebeests and giraffes right on your doorstep. Warm rooms offer free Wi-Fi and flat-screen TVs, plus minibars, and tea and coffeemaking facilities. Upgraded rooms and suites provide access to a lounge with free breakfast, drinks, and snacks. Room service is available 24/7.

Dine on international classics and Kenyan dishes all day in the Larder restaurant, or savor haute cuisine at Chop House, an all-day eatery, and a poolside grill. There is an outdoor pool, a sauna, and a fitness room, as well as a business center and 12 meeting rooms. Spa services are available.

Nakuru Hotel



This tranquil retreat is 15 km from Lake Nakuru National Park, 12 km from the Menengai Crater View Point and 5 km from the Nakuru Railway Station.

Warmly decorated rooms include free Wi-Fi, flat-screen TVs, and tea and coffeemakers, plus sitting areas, minibars, and safes. Suites add living rooms and provide access to the executive lounge.

Amenities include a charming indoor restaurant which specializes in African and Indian cuisine, an open-air eatery, and a relaxed lounge bar, plus a spa with massage services.

Kisumu Hotel




Beautiful architecture, a spacious setup and lush gardens create a beautiful and peaceful environment overlooking Lake Victoria, this sophisticated hotel is a 13-minute walk from the Kisumu Impala Sanctuary and 1 km from the Kisumu Railway Station.

The refined rooms offer free Wi-Fi, flatscreen TVs and sitting areas. Some rooms feature lake views. Room service is available 24/7.

There are three eateries Maestro, a la carte restaurant, serves up an eclectic menu, encompassing French, Italian and Indian cuisines. In addition, a gym and an outdoor pool. There are also conference facilities, plus a spa with a steam room

Maasai Mara Hotel



Surrounded by the Oloolaimutia Hills, this downto-earth game reserve is 48 km from an entrance gate to the Maasai Mara National Reserve and 74 km from Mara Serena Airport.

Set in traditional conical cottages, the warm rooms come with safes, mosquito nets, and verandas with garden and game reserve views. Suites add sitting areas.

Complimentary breakfast is served in a circular dining room that features a fireplace and a deck. Afternoon tea and snacks, lunch and dinner are available. Other amenities consist of a relaxed lounge bar, an outdoor pool, and a poolside bar with a TV and a pool table.

Mombasa Hotel



Wake up to a beachfront landscape, this highend resort is 11 minutes' walk from Jomo Kenyatta Public Beach and 10 km from the Mombasa city centre.

Relaxed rooms offer free Wi-Fi, flat-screen TVs and minibars, plus mosquito nets and balconies with sea and/or pool views.

There is a hot tub with sea views, plus a gym and a water sports centre. Restaurants are trendy and chic Lido lounge or the exclusive Cocos Beach Bar, overlooking the serene Indian ocean beach. There are also five outdoor swimming pools with water slides, springboard and diving boards as well as a variety of exciting water sports, a beachfront bar and a nightclub.
